Clean energy from coal

The coal gasifier will produce clean syngas from coal, which will be used to fire a gas turbine in the combined cycle plant to provide electricity to the grid. The emissions from integrated gasification combined cycle plants are significantly lower than conventional coal-fired power plants. The plant, located in Genesee, Alberta, is designed to capture approximately 85 per cent of the CO₂ contained in the coal for enhanced oil recovery in existing oil fields. www.siemens.com
